- 1997 Château Ormes de Pez, St-Estèphe\$24.99**
According to the *Wine Spectator*: "Delicious, with plum, spice and vanilla character. Medium-bodied, with silky tannins and a fresh fruit finish..." (01/2000)
- 1997 Clos du Marquis, St-Julien\$39.99**
According to the *Wine Spectator*: "This red has mineral, currant and mint aromas. Medium- to full-bodied, with polished tannins and a fruity, succulent finish. An early drinking Las Cases, yet a very good red for the vintage."

According to Robert Parker: "This deep ruby-colored wine reveals abundant quantities of mature fruit in a medium-bodied, charming format. It exhibits good depth, low acidity and little tannin."

- 2001 Bahans Haut-Brion, Pessac\$39.99**
According to Robert Parker: "Always one of Bordeaux's finest second wines, the 2001 Bahans Haut-Brion exhibits a dark plum/ruby color as well as a sweet nose of cedar, earth and red and black currants. Medium bodied with a supple texture, fine purity and admirable length."
- 2003 Château Fourcas Hosten, Listrac\$15.99**
Showing remarkable structure and a great aromatic delicacy, this 2003 consists of 45% merlot, 45% cabernet sauvignon and 10% cabernet franc from 25-year old vines.

Trey's Picks for August

- 2005 La Crema Sonoma Coast Chardonnay\$14.99**
Fresh aromas of citrus, butterscotch and lemon peel open to appealing hints of jasmine and nutmeg! On the palate, rich buttercream, pear and citrus meld to create a plush, round middle.
- 2005 Taz Santa Barbara Pinot Noir\$17.99**
In this rich and fruit filled Pinot Noir, the folks at Taz pulled together fruit from the Santa Maria Valley and the Santa Rita Hills—two very different sites with contrasting signatures. When blended, you get a blackberry burst in the wine with cola spice and juicy, jammy berry notes supported by a balancing act of tannins and structure.
- 2004 Stag's Leap Winery Napa Merlot\$21.99**
Aromatics of ripe, red cherry and sweet strawberry jam lead to flavors of rich red fruit, toasted almonds, dried thyme and rosemary, with a hint of black truffles. The firm tannic structure holds the melody of flavors together as a full-bodied mid palate carries through to a long finish complete with hints of licorice, black chocolate and orange peel.

2006 Bordeaux—Finally!

It's July and we are almost finished with the opening prices for the 2006 Bordeaux wines. This has been the longest Primeur campaign for Bordeaux that I can remember and we've been selling Bordeaux on pre-arrival since 1978.

Of the latest wines to open, there were a few surprises. Léoville-Las Cases opened quite a bit below their 2005 level! Palmer and Angelus, both fabulous 2006s were aggressive with their price. Cos d'Estournel was reasonable while the white wines of Pape-Clément, Margaux, La Mission and Haut-Brion are in the stratosphere! Six wines that you must have in 2006—Cantemerle, Clos du Marquis, Lynch-Bages, Pontet-Canet, Pichon Lalande and Malescot-St. Exupéry! All are better than their 2005 counterparts!

Bearden's Bordeaux Picks

Classically styled and affordable, the 2004 Bordeaux have arrived and there is something for everyone's taste and pocketbook.

2004 Château Pontet-Canet, Pauillac (\$52.99) One of the stars of the vintage. Very concentrated and deep with lots of cherry/berry fruit in the dense middle. This claret is tight and tannic right now but exhibits beautiful balance and structure. Affordable and classic!

2004 Château Pichon Lalande, Pauillac (\$69.99) Big and structured for this property, yet still approachable with decanting. The aromas are of deep merlot fruit with dark chocolate, black cherries and oak. The middle is plump, dark and fresh with rich red and black fruit and well-integrated tannins. Great wine!

2004 Château Kirwan, Margaux (\$46.99) A third growth with a great track record over the last five years. Smells of flowers, cedar, oak and ripe fruit. This is full-bodied and structured with rich currant and berry flavors and even a touch of leather on the finish; drink now or age.

2004 Château Lafon-Rochet, St-Estèphe (\$28.99) This affordable Fourth Growth opens up with scents of dusky fruit, earth, herbs and a touch of damp clay. Elegant and medium-bodied, this is quite ripe in the middle and sweet on the finish. A tasty bargain from a consistent property.

2004 Château Latour, Pauillac (\$369.00) 95 pts RP: "The dark ruby/purple-tinged 2004 Latour exhibits a strong cassis character intermixed with notes of crushed rocks, earth, cedar and forest floor. Racy, elegant, yet powerful with medium to full body and sweet tannin, it will benefit from 5 to 7 years of cellaring and should keep for 3 decades. It's a very impressive offering."

2004 Château Lafite-Rothschild, Pauillac (Inquire) 92-94 pts RP: "One of the better wines of the vintage, the elegantly-styled 2004 Lafite-Rothschild reveals hints of lead pencil, crushed rocks, flowers, crème de cassis and cranberries. Medium-bodied with considerable finesse, length, ripeness and structure...it requires 3 to 5 years of cellaring."

Brick's Bordeaux Picks

Boy, oh boy do I have a great lineup of wines for you this month. Four absolute no brainers handed to you on a silver platter. First, two wines from Château du Tertre. The **2001 Château du Tertre, Margaux (\$39.99)** is packed with aromas of peppered beef and wet stone. This supple, sweet fruited wine has a coating, generous texture and rich flavors of red plum, caraway and blueberry. A bit more powerful and structured is the **2000 Château du Tertre, Margaux (\$49.99)**. This shows the unmistakable weight and depth of the 2000 vintage. Full of tart cherry fruit, black currant, black tea and a pretty woody tone, this is a complete wine front to back. Persistent tannin and acid make this enjoyable now, but even better in a few years.

One of our favorite producers, Pontet-Canet, has been knocking wines out of the park lately and the **1997 Château Pontet-Canet, Pauillac (Inquire)** is no exception. While 1997 was a difficult year, this, we believe, was one of the best of the vintage, with a beautiful, sweet, berry coulis, vanilla bean nose and subtle clay, heirloom tomato and raspberry flavors. Overall this is more earthy than sweet, a food wine with plenty of terroir, perfect for the dinner table.

Last, the **1994 Château Ducru-Beaucaillou, St-Julien (\$86.99)**. Again another top wine from a difficult vintage; this is stunning. It has everything you look for in top Bordeaux: power, density of flavor, finesse, structure. Spice cake with black currant and licorice come wafting out of the glass, just to be outdone by similar flavors on the palate, picking up even more complexity, adding lavender and bay leaf spice and more sweet plum fruit. Enjoy!

Bordeaux 2006: The Firsts and the Affordables

The excellent 2006 vintage produced wines of bright freshness, nice mid-weight fruit, with charm and elegance. And since many of the Bordeaux property owners, who raised their prices in 2005 to be more in line with California's expensive cult wines, set their 2006 prices 10-30% below the '05s, the majority are priced fairly in the world market. So while some of the top wines may be out of reach for all except the billionaires of the world—2006 is an accessible vintage for American lovers and collectors of Bordeaux. Below are my comments on the first growths and then on the super-value-packed wines of 2006.

Ch. Haut-Brion (Inquire) Powerful aromas of perfectly ripe grapes and leather, very classic and intensely focused.

Ch. Margaux (\$539.99) A fine expression of high-toned pure fruit, strong and elegant, slightly less opulent than some recent releases; it finishes with good spice.

Ch. Lafite-Rothschild (\$529.99) Exotic tinge to the ripe grapes, strong/brisk acidity make this wine a elegant distance runner.

Ch. Latour (\$539.99) The Latour is ultra thick, exotic old vine fruit. Powerful, massive and concentrated. The softness of the tannins is impressive and holds this great wine together.

Ch. Mouton-Rothschild (Inquire) Strong and precisely focused crushed red fruits. Lovely tannin control here as well; absolutely no harshness through to the strong and long finish. Superb! Best since 1986!

A few of the superb values...

Ch. Pontet-Canet (\$69.99) I love this again! A big dark purple wine of great freshness and power. Blueberry/blackberry fruit is almost creamy in the middle. Very complex wine.

Ch. Lynch-Bages (\$67.99) A serious and superb Lynch. Black fruits with red tinges, the high-toned fruit is round and viscous and it has the textbook Lynch aromas of cigar and wood. A real winner; better than 2005!

Ch. Pichon-Longueville Comtesse de Lalande (\$118.99) Very close to 2005—maybe better. Great freshness as always on the nose, sweet and spicy on the palate with good thickness and overall mouth feel. Layers of fruit in this wine. Multi-dimensional.

Ch. Pichon-Longueville Baron (\$93.99) Great sweetness from this masculine wine, very deep earthy-berry fruit, good roundness, the tannins are also strong but harmonious.

Ch. Langoa-Barton (\$54.99) Deep cassis fruit with cranberry tinges, the fruit is sweet but strong, focused and balanced.

Ch. Cos d'Estournel (\$128.99) A really strong and powerful Cos with a tightly focused core of deep black-brown, spicy fruit, claret style.

Ch. Malescot-St. Exupéry (\$46.99) Very fine nose of roses and violets, deep regal fruit, good thick middle, little creamy. Nice tannins, good long finish, superb wine!

Clos Roche Blanches

Summer in the Bay Area is a funny thing... Folks come to visit, thinking August in California means shorts and sandals, sun and fun—then they end up buying a cheap San Francisco sweatshirt in Chinatown. Since France in February feels like San Francisco in July, off-season traveling isn't much of a shock. Standing atop the hillside vineyards of Clos Roches Blanches last February, it wasn't hard for me to see that it's one of the most beautiful places in the world—despite the bare trees. There's a view over the treetops of the Cher River, with high-speed train tracks running along its bank and a huge fan in the middle of the vineyard, used to protect against frost when the temperature dips. Despite these modern elements, this place is the essence of agrarian—vines line up in neat rows over the top of the hill, surrounded by woods inhabited by deer and boar. Catherine Roussel and Didier Barrouillet tend this land for Clos Roche Blanche with respect; it's been in the Roussel family since the 19th century. Their main goal is to keep the land alive and have the vineyard be a vital part of the surrounding ecosystem. To that end, they farm organically, keeping a keen eye on the effects of their choices. Their pursuit of understanding has led to a government grant to study natural farming techniques (the leeks growing between the rows during my last visit were an example of this exploration). With all of this heady thought, the wines are still incredibly down to earth, both in style and price. They really should not be missed. Try the **2005 Clos Roche Blanche Touraine Pif (\$14.99)**, a blend of cot and cabernet franc and **2006 Clos Roche Blanche Touraine Sauvignon Blanc (\$13.99)**.

High On Rhône

Domaine Jaume lies in the new AOC, Vinsobres, which was part of the Côtes du Rhône-Villages appellation until 2005. Its vineyards lie up to 1,500 feet (420 meters) above sea level. The altitude leads to an amazing concentration in the wines—cool nights and long, warm days lead to grapes with thicker skins and lots of flavor that still maintain their refreshing acidity. The Jaume family has been making wine in the Southern Rhône for generations and have established themselves as one of the best.

2004 Côtes du Rhône “Generation” Domaine Jaume (\$9.99) This is a great little bottle of wine: soft, easy drinking and it has great crowd appeal. Upfront fruit and spice are rounded out by fine, well integrated tannins. The palate is punctuated by notes of blueberry and herbs and ends with a smooth finish. At this price, it’s a winner as an everyday wine and for summer entertaining.

2005 Vinsobres “Altitude 420” Domaine Jaume (\$13.99) The spectacular 2005 vintage was a landmark year for Domaine Jaume. It not only marks the Domaine’s 100 year anniversary, it is also the first vintage to bear the newly declared Vinsobres AOC on the label. But, don’t let these accomplishments distract you from what is of utmost importance—the quality of the wine. The 2005 “Altitude 420” is bolder and more powerful than it has been in recent vintages, yet retains its characteristic vibrancy and elegance. Scintillating aromas of violet, tobacco and fig are punctuated by darker notes of graphite. The wine possesses great depth, concentration and finesse and received 90 points from *Wine Spectator* to boot!

Jim C’s View Down Under

Without a doubt, Rustenberg is one of the top wines you can taste from South Africa. The **2004 John X Merriman Stellenbosch South Africa (\$28.99)** is a blend of 46% merlot, 36% cabernet sauvignon, 9% cabernet franc and 9% petite verdot. The bouquet offers notes of cedar, spice, red current, dark cherry and a hint of cocoa powder. There is superb balance with good acidity and integrated use of oak that lead to a long finish. This outstanding wine also received 93 points from the *Wine Enthusiast*. The **2005 Rustenberg Chardonnay Stellenbosch South Africa (\$17.99)**, which is hand-harvested from 20-year old vines, manages to walk the line between old and new world wine. The nose has aromas of pineapple, peach, ginger, spice, a hint of honey and a Burgundian mineral note. On the palate, the wine is in perfect harmony with fruit and oak in balance, juicy acidity and great length.

2005 Inkwel “Wild Thing” Shiraz McLaren Vale South Australia (\$19.99) This is the debut vintage for Inkwel and a very impressive start at that. I met Dudley Brown, an American, a few years ago in Australia when he was just getting his vineyard in shape. Dudley is among the vines 5-7 days a week, working by hand. His dedication and passion show in the quality of fruit. Cropped at two tons to the acre, the wine shows dense, classic McLaren Vale fruit with a bouquet that leaps from the glass with blue and blackberries, violets, earth, Asian spices and milk chocolate notes. On the palate the wine is plush with silky tannins and a long finish. It’s a treat to be on the ground floor and bring this first release to you.

Cecile is a young vigneronne based in Sablet who, following in the footsteps of her vintner father, produces many fabulous Rhône wines: from inexpensive Vin de Pays to Châteauneuf-du-Pape. She brings an elegant touch and modern style to this traditional region. Loyal K&L customers will recognize her name as we have carried many of her wines. Below are two 2005 selections that represent outstanding value and are delicious!

2005 Châteauneuf-du-Pape "K&L Cuvée" Cecile Chassagne (\$19.99) A very tasty Châteauneuf-du-Pape for less than \$20? Yes it is possible! Thanks to our good friend and winemaker Cecile Chassagne we are able to offer this deliciously approachable Châteauneuf-du-Pape from the opulent 2005 vintage. The 2005 K&L CNP cuvée from Cecile Chassagne offers up copious dark berry aromas, along with hints of lavender and spice. On the palate, the wine is well rounded with mouth-filling blackcurrant, ripe cherry, savory meat notes and hints of black pepper. It finishes with delicate, sweet tannins. Enjoy now through 2010. Another stellar value from the Rhône Valley, so don't miss out!

2005 Côtes du Rhône, Cecile Chassagne (\$10.99) The 2005 Cecile Chassagne Côtes du Rhône is a delicious wine from a great vintage in France. In the glass, the wine is deep ruby red with violet hues. On the nose there's an explosion of rich berry aromas with notes of violets and spice. On the palate, the wine is well rounded with mouth-filling fruit, a bit of spice and a good balance of acidity and fruit. It finishes with delicate, sweet tannins. Decant this wine for half an hour before drinking to allow it to show its best. Hurry—almost sold out!

Chip's Quips: August

It's so hot in August in L.A. you can fry an egg on the sidewalk. That's why everybody's looking for the pause that refreshes. So with that in mind, allow me to put forth a line up of wines that will slake your thirst, wet your whistle, and, generally speaking, hydrate your chops.

2005 Pouilly-Fuissé "Solutre" Auvigue (\$19.99) This is no ordinary Pouilly. It comes from a vineyard just below the massive Solutre Cliff in Pouilly-Fuissé. The vines are 75 years old, making for a super concentrated wine. Jean-Peirre Auvigue also does an unusual thing for Pouilly-Fuissé, he ages the wine in oak, giving it a rounder, fuller character that most Pouillys don't have. But don't think this is some big butter bomb that's going to wear on your palate like another news flash about Paris Hilton. Lime, green apples and pears combine with a hint of tropical fruit to give this wine all the complexity it needs. And when you put all that with a finish that is the epitome of crisp freshness you have an ideal summer treat.

2006 Gunn Estate Sauvignon Blanc New Zealand (\$12.99) The Gunn Estate is located in Hawkes Bay's Ohiti Valley. They've been growing grapes since 1983 and making wine since 1994. This wine really pops with freshness. It's got all the ingredients of classic New Zealand sauvignon blanc: grapefruit, lemongrass, fresh herbs and crisp green apple. It also has a nice little tinge of the tropics to it as well, leaning towards the passion fruit, pineapple variety. You say your tongue is sticking to the roof of your mouth with dehydration? K&L has the perfect remedy: a glass of Gunn Estate Sauvignon Blanc.

NV Broadbent Vinho Verde Portugal (\$8.99) The reason this wine is non-vintage is that Vinho Verde should be really fresh, as in made yesterday. Broadbent's Vinho Verde is as fresh as they come. He ships it in refrigerated containers as soon they've finished bottling, giving it its textbook spritz. It has a lime green color and a lime fresh flavor. Great with shellfish, salads, or just as an aperitif for drinking at the Hollywood Bowl. You will keep coming back for more of this delightful little wine. Their website describes it as "An ideal warm weather wine," and boy, are they ever right!

Essences of plum chutney, huckleberry, loganberry, Marion berry and rose petals fill the nose. A dusting of spice, subtle tannins and an overall lithe structure complete the outward balance of this delicious wine.

Whole cluster pressed and with four months of lees contact, this wine has lots of dimension, but is still crisp and lively, with hints of grass, melon and white peach; this is your poolside sipper!

2006 Joel Gott Monterey Chardonnay (\$12.99) If you are looking for clean, crisp chardonnay to whet your palate, then the Gott Monterey Chard is your wine! The Monterey appellation is one of the most diverse and climatically cool grape growing regions in California. The fog from Monterey Bay cools the air and slows maturity, allowing the grapes to develop classic varietal characteristics and a natural balance between sugar and acidity by harvest time. No hints of oak in this one—just bright, cool climate chardonnay fruit!

2006 Robert Sinskey "Abraxas Vin de Terroir" (\$26.99) Abraxas is an interesting blend of riesling, gewurztraminer, pinot blanc and pinot gris. Each component adds something unique to this blend. A fresh, floral nose is followed by a lively, racy wine that shows hints of citrus, white nectarine and lavender. The finish is clean and refreshing.

The prices for California Cabernet Sauvignon seem to be going through the roof. Many of these wines are excellent, but don't deserve the price being asked. In contrast, these wines are from little-known producers and they're well worth the price...

2004 Sherwin Family Vineyards Cabernet Sauvignon, Spring Mountain (\$86.99) I'm a big fan of Spring Mountain wine: Philip Togni, Terra Valentine, Coniglio and now Sherwin Family. 93 points *Wine Spectator*: "A big, rich, intense and tightly focused style, with layers of red cherry, wild berry, earth, mineral and savory herbs and spices. Picks up a nice touch of anise and ends with firm, ripe, integrated tannins, with a dash of cedary oak."

2002 Garden Creek Alexander Valley Cabernet Sauvignon (\$59.99) Garden Creek is a bio-dynamic producer in the Alexander Valley. This is a beautiful, balanced wine with superb blue and red fruit, tobacco and a hint of earth with soft tannins. This is an example of the new quality coming out of the Alexander Valley.

2004 Ladera "Howell Mountain" Cabernet Sauvignon (\$64.99) An excellent, family owned winery that makes several excellent cabs. It is fruit forward with ripe, classic Howell Mountain black cherry, blackberry aromas and plum hints, which are intertwined with subtle oak nuances. On the palate, this wine is weighty, but not flabby. The tannins are long and velvety. This wine is made for the cellar.

Brick's Backyard Picks: Tablas Creek Edition

Tablas Creek began as joint project between the Perrin family, of Château Beaucastel fame, and Robert Haas, founder of Vineyard Brands, a tremendous import company. Widely regarded as one of the best, if not *the* best producer of Rhône varieties in the country, we are incredibly excited and somewhat honored that we have been granted access to some of Tablas Creek's winery direct wines. These wines have never been offered outside the winery walls (unless you count their informative website). These wines are a one-shot deal; once they're gone they're gone, so act fast.

2005 Tablas Creek Vermentino, Paso Robles (\$26.99) This varietal, sometimes known as Rolle in the south of France, is grown in numerous coastal regions in Italy. Crisp and racy this is full of crushed mineral and briny, lemon zest. Think muscadet on steroids. Add a lovely nutty character and an overall refreshing nature and you have a perfect wine for seafood.

Another of the wines available to us is the little seen counoise. This varietal is used in Southern Rhône blends and is one of the thirteen red-skinned grapes accepted in Châteauneuf-du-Pape. But the **2005 Tablas Creek Counoise, Paso Robles (\$32.99)** is more similar to Cru Beaujolais than Châteauneuf. With its pure crushed Bing cherry nose backed by a persistent earth quality, this is fun yet serious. White raspberry, strawberry and a slight hint of thyme makes this a knockout barbecue wine. Come see why we think these wines are so special.

Mi España

Spain is the country of my heart and soul—*la corazon, el alma*. My grandmother was born in a tiny town in the hills of Navarra, one of the country's many amazing winegrowing regions. While not necessarily from Navarra, the following wines speak of the sun, the earth and the heart of the warm and generous people who live in that most magical country, España.

The **2006 Burgans Albariño (\$9.99)** is a charming white from one of the largest wineries in Galicia. Burgans was really the first albariño to be a big hit here in America more than 15 years ago. A perennial bargain favorite in the *Wine Advocate*, this white has classic aromas of white peach and honeysuckle. Its long, crisp finish makes it lively and fresh. Mariola Varona, their export manager, would probably tell you to have this wine with some fresh seafood.

The **2003 Viña Izadi Crianza (\$13.99)** is classic Rioja. The Anton family's love for all things gastronomic shows in the pure expression of high quality product. Ripe black cherry fruit from tempranillo complements the spice and richness of vanillin oak. Enjoy this red with garlicky rich lamb chops hot off the grill.

Roberto and Oscar Aragon are brothers from the tiny Ribera del Duero town of Quintana del Pidio. Their **2005 Cillar de Silos El Quintanal Vendimia Seleccionada (\$17.99)** represents some of the finest value in the region. 90 points in the *Wine Advocate*, the Quintanal is full of dark blackberry fruit and spice. The complexity and depth of this wine make it a perfect match for a juicy steak.

The first thing I ever remember hearing about wine was, "Lopez de Heredia is the greatest wine in all of Spain!" I was about five. Still true, the **1998 Lopez de Heredia Viña Tondonia Reserva, Rioja (\$38.99)** is rich, powerful, deep and complex. Keep this in your cellar for awhile.

Hipsters know what's cool and how to find it. Wine explorers search and find gems. Whichever you are, head straight to our Spanish wine section and seek out these three delights:

2005 Luna Beberide Mencia (\$11.99) There are plenty of perfectly balanced food friendly reds at K&L to choose from. I particularly love those made from the mencia grape in Northwest Spain's Bierzo region. This example is all sappy dark fruit, with the deliciously dense structure common in '05 European reds.

2005 Rafael Palacios Louro Godello (\$13.99) This godello is soft with a pretty, gentle citrus fruit character, perhaps a suggestion of starfruit. Try this for a non-traditional pairing: Asiago and pea ravioli with butter, shallots, English peas, chopped mint and grated asiago.

2005 Dominio dos Tares Estay Prieto Picudo (\$13.99) Prieto picudo is the hot new grape, like the first fixed gear spotted on Valencia or Delfina in its opening year. Full of brambly, blackberry character, with amazing freshness and complexity, think top-notch Dry Creek AVA zinfandel with more acidity and mineral/floral notes. Be among the first to discover this Castillian gem.

Germany: 2006 Favorite

Not many of the wines from 2006 have hit the shores, most will arrive around October/November, but a few tasty treats are here and on our shelves. The 2006 vintage was tricky to say the least: There was rain before and during harvest, rampant rot (mostly the bad kind) and producers had to scramble to drop infected fruit, get the grapes in fast and press off the juice before the weather worsened. My friends in Germany tell of very long and stressful days, having trouble finding enough pickers on such short notice and a crop that was even smaller than the short 2005 vintage. Once you peel away all that misery, there are still some pretty nice wines, though you must be selective. The 2006 vintage is very ripe, with levels equal to 2003 and 2005 at most estates, yet there is overall much better acidity than 2003. More on the vintage later...

For now, let me suggest a lovely wine to whet your appetite for 2006 and show you just how tasty and satisfying these wines can be.

The **2006 Dr. Heyden Oppenheimer Sacktrager Spätlese (\$15.99)** is, by a long shot, one of the greatest deals in riesling. Young Frank Heyden has taken over the reins of this family estate and he is intent on bringing back the fame of the Sacktrager a vineyard, once renowned for its fine, elegant wines. This wine, redolent of stone fruits, wisteria and mint, is poised, vibrant and snappy. You will love it now and surely you should stash a case away to start drinking in 2016; at this price how could you not?

Cab Franc?

Not over-extracted or surrounded by new, charred oak barrels for way too long, cabernet franc retains a sense of terroir and has a bit of acid to it too. The grape thrives in the Loire Valley, particularly the Touraine, where it is said that the wine mirrors the land. On the far western edge of the Touraine, across the Loire River from the famed commune of Chinon, quietly tucked away is St-Nicholas-de-Bourgueil. Here the vines have their roots firmly planted into the gravelly terraces, which produces a lighter, more delicate style of cab franc with a bit of nerve. When the wines are fermented in stainless steel you get a true sense of the varietal character, without it being muddled by those, shall we say, "other" techniques. The **2005 Frédéric Mabileau St-Nicolas-de-Bourgueil les Rouillères (\$13.99)** is one such wine. Harvested from vines ranging in age from 15 to 35 years old, it underwent an aggressive pre-harvest triage, was de-stemmed prior to fermentation and underwent an 8-10 day maceration. Aged in stainless steel tanks for 7-9 months this is a clean, bright, pure expression of cabernet franc that really sings on its own or with fresh flavors from your local farmers market. The **2005 Joel Taluau St-Nicolas-de-Bourgueil Expression (\$12.99)** is a cuvée from vines planted in calcium rich soils. Enticing aromas of violet and a fleshy fruit front, backed up by a dark black fruit cut keeps this wine nice and lively.

A Hot and Heavy Summer

August is kind of the “time out” month for K&L, when folks are on vacation or incognito. This is siesta month, when the only activity seems to originate at the strip malls, movie theatres and ballparks and bibliophiles turn to puzzles and pulp fiction to give their noggins a much needed recharging. August—when Ralph briefly stops cursing the telephone for ringing. Be thankful—always be thankful, but more so in August because a) You are not a roofer, b) You are not a Newfoundland and c) you are not a Phillies fan.

August can seem a bit backwards, too—we feature wines like Port and dense, heavy red wines and expect you, the Consumer, to respond in 100 degree heat. I’ll not do Port, but I’d like to pitch some lovely red wines and ask you to imagine the plunge in weather that is mere months in the future.

We’ve stocks of the **Beaulieu Vineyard Private Reserve Cabernet Sauvignon** from the august vintages of 1977 and 1984. Both have quite recently migrated from winery to the K&L cellars, so nonpareil storage is assured. The ’77 (**\$89.95**) has come on so strong in the last decade that it is now considered one of the great B.V.’s of the last 30 years. The wine is full of black fruit with a racy, refreshingly vibrant quality. While I’d not call it typical B.V. Reserve, I would call it outstanding. The ’84 (**\$79.95**) flaunts classic B.V. house style, all herbs and dust and American oak and red fruits and elegance. It is ready when you are willing.

From across the pond we’ve got a **1998 Château Margaux (Inquire)**. This left banker from a right bank vintage? Oh, don’t go all vintage assessments on me; this is a stunning wine, sturdy and noble and waking from a much-needed slumber. In the case of the ’98s, you’ll find upward reassessment as the wines mature; the 1998 Margaux is a relative bargain in Bordeaux’s upper echelon.

Margaux’s doppelganger opposite (dopplezit?) is the **Château Ducru-Beaucaillou**, the great St-Julien. Always firm and solidly structured, the marriage of the house and firm and elegant vintage of 1970 means

Jim’s August Gems

Two Aprils ago, Mike and Greg discovered one of the finest Proseccis that this wine staff has ever tasted. The **Silvano Follador Prosecco Valdobbiadene Brut (\$12.99)**, produced by a very young brother/sister winemaking team, Silvano and Alberta Follador, continues to be a stunning sparkler, showing bright perfumed aromatics that lead to a perfectly balanced, crisp, refreshing and delicate mouthfeel with lime zest and a touch of yeastiness. *Gambero Rosso* gave this one glass and, more importantly, Vanilla has informed me that this is our house sparkler for the summer. (🍾🍾🍾🍾🍾🍾)

Grapgrower Lou Bock, a friend of mine for the past thirty years, grows some of the finest sauvignon blanc on the North Coast at his Redwood Valley estate, Chance Creek Vineyards, north of Ukiah. Organically grown, the **2005 Chance Creek Sauvignon Blanc, Redwood Valley (\$12.99)** is a clean, snappy sauvignon blanc with a mouthwatering finish, making it a perfect wine for freshly cooked North Coast crab or grilled fish. This will be our house white for August, according to the Eb. (🍷🍷🍷🍷🍷🍷)

K&L’s latest pinot noir release has Anderson hooting, a cross between a howl and a bark, like he joyously does each time a fire engine passes the house with its siren blaring (this Brit secretly wants to be a Dalmatian). But there is no secret as to the incredibly superb quality of the **2006 Kalinda Sonoma Pinot Noir (\$17.99)**. Brilliant, medium

that, as Yoda would say, “Much age the wine to mature did need.” Utterly classy and all earthy, herbal elegance, this wine has ridden on a plateau for some years now and needs drinking in the next few. It has always been a favorite of mine, first enjoyed with Monsieur Clyde Beffa in the tiny courtyard of the Hotel St Dominique, a value priced and utterly charming Parisian gem.

Last, though not least: **1993 Château d’Yquem (\$139.99)**. Americans don’t drink much Sauternes, but we always seem to make room for arguably the greatest of all dessert wines. Intensely ripe, the sweet white peaches and pineapples fight to get out of the glass first and this focused cacophony is exhilarating. The ’93 is complete and complex and has matured a bit more quickly than many vintages. So, better to have this one now, says I.

One of the pitfalls that affect many of us in an escalated market is that we begin to relate high prices to better quality. While only a tiny number of wines open at astronomical prices or fetch thousands of dollars at auction, they seem to command 99 percent of the accolades from trade journals. Lately I have found myself telling customers, “don’t let this price scare you, it’s only \$9.99 and it’s really good.” With that off of my chest, YOU really need to try the **2005 Château Haut Sociendo Premieres Côtes De Blaye (\$10.99)**. Deeply colored, the nose explodes with cassis, currants and roasted coffee beans. Big, rich, and full, yet round, lush and silky, this is just an absolute pleasure to consume. The Wine God called this a “terrific value... sleeper of vintage” (04/06) and Anderson says this deserves some very serious consideration for Jim’s Gems Hall Of Fame. Don’t let this great price scare you—stockpile it! (🍷🍷🍷🍷🍷🍷)

What a Difference 500 Feet Makes

Two of our most interesting and very best values in Champagne are from vineyards less than 500 feet apart, the **Leclerc Briant "Les Chèvres Pierreuses"** and **"Les Crayères"** (both \$29.99). Pascal Leclerc grows grapes biodynamically and these two vineyards are treated completely organically. The "Les Chèvres Pierreuses" is a blend of 41% pinot noir, 19% meunier and 40% chardonnay from a seven-acre plot that is covered in small stones. The "Les Crayères" is composed of 38% pinot noir, 37% meunier and 25% chardonnay from a two and two thirds acre vineyard that has the highest chalk content of all of Pascal's estate. Every time that I taste them I am surprised, and even often forget, that the Pierreuses has the higher chardonnay content... I could mistake the Crayères for a blanc de blanc given its chalk driven minerality. It is one of the liveliest, cleanest bottles of Champagne in our stock. The Chèvres Pierreuses is elegant, round and subtle—perhaps the best celebratory bottle in our stock and perfect for having on its own. Both are made very differently than most Champagnes, co- pressed, then fermented in tile and concrete instead of stainless steel or wood.

Celebrate With Champagnes of Tarlant!

You might not think that August is much of a celebratory month but, with the arrival of the Champagnes of Tarlant, this month couldn't be any sweeter. The Tarlant family has been around for 310 years and has the experience to back up their "cult" status in France. The **Tarlant Brut Reserve (\$27.99)** is a blend of one third each chardonnay, pinot noir and pinot meunier. The fruit comes from hillsides in Oeuilly in the Vallee de la Marne. This particular release of the Brut Reserve is a blend of the 2002, 2003 and 2004 vintages. Inhale aromas of fresh bread dough and pears as they waft out of the glass. In the mouth, experience more pears, golden apples, nuts and cream. This wine is rich and heady, but light and refreshing on the finish. We also carry its "sister" wine, the **Tarlant Brut Zero (\$27.99)**. The Zero is the yin to the Reserve's yang. Although it is the same blend as the Brut Reserve, the Zero is a *no dosage* (no sugar added) "ultra" Brut Champagne. It's pure, unadulterated, clean fruit and minerality, with zesty citrus fruit aspects of lemon/lime and tangerine, wet stones and granny smith apples. Barrel ageing and the addition of reserve stock to the blend results in an "ultra" Brut style that also has depth, texture and richness. And while the Reserve and Zero are amazing, the **Tarlant Cuvée Louis Brut (\$42.99)** is one of my most favorite Champagnes in the store, regardless of price. In fact, I have tasted some that are twice its price without its character. Made from 50% chardonnay and 50% pinot noir from the chalkiest portions of Tarlant's hillside vineyards in Oeuilly, all of the vines are more than 45 years old. This cuvée is aged in oak for 13 months and on the lees for seven years without malolactic fermentation. The current cuvée is equal parts of the phenomenal 1996 vintage and the 1997 vintage. Low dosage. It has a rich nose of dried apples, vanilla and light yeast and flavors of ripe apples, toast, honey and cinnamon with a dry finish that lingers on the palate. A HUGE hit at our last customer Champagne tasting in June! All Tarlant Champagnes are organic, though they don't publicize this fact.

Chablis For Hot August Days

When the weather is sultry and hot, I love to drink white wines that are crisp and refreshing to wake my palate up before a meal, or to have with some steamed mussels. For me, a top pick is Chablis. We have just found a wonderful candidate, the **2005 Chablis, Cuvée St. Victoire, Domaine Seguinot-Bordet (\$17.99)** and I like it so much I am making it my summer wine. Jeff Vierra, our Loire Valley buyer, and Mike Parres, one of our Italian buyers, both did handsprings over it, too. When I get all of their attention, I know we have something special.

The Seguinot family has been growing Chablis vines since 1590. This Chablis is called St. Victoire, after the family name, which translates to "friendly victor" or "friendly victory" in the ancient Visigoth tongue. It is made from the family's oldest vines, planted in 1935. This results in focus, a rich mid-palate and great weight to accompany the bright minerality on the long finish. This is all hand-harvested, which is critical for quality, but all too rare at the village level in Chablis. Fifteen to twenty percent is fermented in wood and the remainder is fermented in horizontal stainless tanks, which Jean-Francois had specially built to increase lees contact. Although twice as expensive as conventional tanks, these allow 75% of all of the wine to remain within 3 feet of the lees, to pick up more richness than the upright tanks, while retaining crisp minerality. The success of this method is clearly seen here in the glass! Don't Miss This! Á Sante!

Alpine Delight!

I’ve always been captivated by Northern Italian red wines. It’s all too easy to be seduced by nebbiolo and charmed by the easy going dolcetto, but I think there’s something special about the red wines from the dramatic landscapes of Italy’s northeast, particularly the Trentino-Alto Adige. The **Elisabetta Foradori 2003 Teroldego Rotaliano (\$18.99)** is one such wine. Teroldego is an heirloom varietal grown in the alluvial deposits around the Adige and Noce rivers where the soils are composed of limestone, granite and porphyry debris; it has had a reputation for making exceptional wines in these parts since the 18th Century. Elisabetta Foradori is the first lady of Teroldego; while people were aware of the varietal, it was not until her wines made it into the world marketplace that they started to pay attention, especially to her luxury cuvée, the Grana-to! Known for being a low acid varietal, Teroldego stands out from other traditional indigenous Italian varietals known for their high acidity. There is a hint of pomegranate in this wine, characteristic of the best Teroldego. The vibrant yet dark red fruits are framed with just a touch of oak spice and the ripe, round tannins and concentrated fruit further the impression of the rich, heady qualities of pomegranate. Medium to medium-full-bodied, this is not a pasta wine, or at least not pasta dressed in a bright fresh tomato sauce. This wants something that is savory—think rabbit ragu or maybe goulash or even a Middle Eastern stew. For those of you who do not want to spend hours in a hot kitchen the summer, try it with grilled pork chops or kebabs and fall in love.

Sul Tappeto Rosso

True or false: 2002 is the worst vintage in history for Brunello di Montalcino?

False. I have long been a believer that vintage tells you everything about the weather for a given year, but little about the wine. Pick me a great vintage and I'll show you a bad wine, pick me a bad vintage and I'll show you a good one. The critics ripped Barolo in 2002, but Barolo's most storied and respected producer, Giacomo Conterno, made his Monfortino in 2002, and they only make that wine in years they consider to be great! Arriving the middle of this month is the **2002 Sesta di Sopra Brunello di Montalcino (\$42.99)**—a stunningly good wine. How did they do it in such a "bad" year? Sesta di Sopra is not a gigantic winery, they produce about 345 cases of Brunello a year and about the same amount of Rosso di Montalcino. They have one hectare (2.471 acres) of Brunello vineyards. In 2002 the entire extended family passed through the vineyard, all armed with tweezers, on six different occasions. On each pass they looked at each bunch of grapes and extracted any shot, mildewed or unripe berries, leaving only the healthiest of grapes. They are also fortunate because their vineyard is extraordinarily well ventilated with superb Galestro soil. The resulting wine is full bodied and shows layers of complex, wild fruit, with hints of rosemary, and leather; it is intriguing, provocative and tempting. Drink this wine now and over the course of the next decade. Decant an hour ahead of time. Don't miss trying the **2005 Sesta di Sopra Rosso di Montalcino (\$19.99)** too. It has the

classic Sesta di Sopra character, yet a little fresher. The vintage is four out of five stars, delightful and drinkable now!

Last year we imported the Ferrero for the first time and their great pricing and forward richness sold out their Brunello faster than we could say Pablo Harri. The **2002 Ferrero Brunello di Montalcino (\$32.99)** is one of the better of the vintage. Their vineyard sits southwest of Montalcino, between Banfi's Poggio all'Oro and Argiano. It gets lots of sun, even in the coolest of vintages. The wine shows lots of spice and ripe plum-like fruit mixed with some wild cherry and a plump richness on the palate with good acidity. It is a classic match for roasted pork loin marinated in rosemary and extra virgin olive oil! The **2005 Ferrero Rosso di Montalcino (\$17.99)** is powerful with lots of soft, muscular richness up front, yet with remarkably good acidity. The flavors can best be described as wild chocolate cherry spiced, with hints of violet and lavender enhanced by a bit of subtle woody flavors on the finish.

I love the classic character of another new arrival, the **2005 Baricci Rosso di Montalcino (\$18.99)**; it is one of my favorites. Baricci's wonderful southeastern exposure on Montalcino's famous Montosoli hill furnishes the wine with such a unique spicy black cherry and gravelly tobacco mix, it is just unmatched. Long and elegant with a supple richness in the mouth, this isn't a blockbuster, just a really pretty wine!

42 Below Vodka New Zealand\$29.99

Arran Gonzalez Bypass Cream Sherry Finish.....\$79.99

3 Stars - Recommended - *Spirit Journal* - F. Paul Pacult. Color: Polished brass. Aroma: Rich, warming layers of confectionary. Golden syrup and ripe fruit: pear, apples & banana. Palate: Creamy & malty, this dram captivates the palate with a dense, mouth-coating sweetness. There are just enough of the classic. Arran citrus notes to provide a zesty burst on the finish. Finish: Silky and smooth, this sugarcoated malt is the perfect digestif to savor long into the night. 756 bottles produced; 57.4% ABV.

BenRiach 15 year Madeira Single Malt Whisky\$79.99

BenRiach 15 year Pedro Ximinez Sherry Finished\$79.99

I was able to try all of the new 15-year "wood finished" whiskies when I visited Benriach in the summer of 2006. I was very impressed with their balance and how Benriach was marrying so well with many different types of cask. Billy Walker, the Master Blender at Benriach, is doing a fantastic job picking out their lovely gems! Benriach is a small, independently owned distillery in the Speyside region. Give one of these a try!

Broker's London Dry Gin (1L)\$22.99

1970 Bruichladdich 125th Anniversary Bottling\$499.99

This special 35-year old bottling has been ACE'd (Additional Cask Enhancement) in Zind Humbrecht Selection de Grain Nobles Pinot Gris wine casks. I was lucky enough to taste this out of the barrel with Jim McEwan in July 2006. Dear God above, I am the luckiest woman on earth to be able to have experiences like these. Liquid gold on the palate. This is a malt to treasure! If you buy one expensive bottle of single malt whisky in your lifetime, make it this bottle!

Bunnahabhain 18 year old Islay Single Malt Whisky\$96.99

I fell in love with older Bunnahabhain on my trip to Islay in 2005. They have such elegance, yet are filled with incredible weight and complexity. Color: rich, golden amber. Nose: Liquid caramel bubbling on the stove, banana cream pie, macadamia nut brittle and the blowing sea breeze. Palate: It lies like heavy syrup that coats your mouth. The flavors are all creamy butter, toasted almonds and Brazil nuts, fresh pipe tobacco and a sea brininess. The weight of the 18-year is like your favorite blanket on a cold winter's day. The finish is extremely long and warming with just a wee bit of spiciness. 92 points - *Malt Advocate*.

Cadenhead's Old Raj Gin 110 Proof\$54.99

Old Raj Gin is distinctive in that it contains a measure of saffron, the rare and costly spice derived from the crocus flower. In addition to the slightly spicy flavor, this also imparts a pale yellow color. The subtle, aristocratic botanical mix (starring, of course, juniper berries) lures you into a warm, delighted sense of well being, a feeling deepened by the sheer silkiness of the spirit. (Preiss Imports 96 - CLASSIC! WE)

1977 Coeur de Lion Pays d'Auge Calvados\$229.99

I had the great honor to visit Christian Drouin and the good folks at Coeur de Lion in June. From the choice of fruit, to fermentation, distillation and maturation in fine oak, great care is taken to make the best possible Calvados.

Edradour Unchillfiltered Signatory\$62.99

I love this bottle of Edradour so much that there is always a bottle at my home. It is great malt for anyone who likes a rich, sweet, heavy sherry style. Classic Edradour, with the additional flavors that come from not chill filtering, which leaves all the natural oils in the bottle. A deep and dark, super rich, sweeter style malt, multi-layered with flavors of roasted nuts and caramel. Dessert!

Ellenstown 10 year Cask Strength Islay Single Malt\$51.99

This one is almost gone, so get it while it lasts! This is one of the best independent, cask strength bottles of an Islay single malt that I have tasted in a long time. Hmmm...Ellenstown, what distillery could this malt be? It has a rich, creamy mouthfeel, touch of sweetness, huge puffs of campfire smoke and a wee bit of iodine. FANTASTIC! 58% ABV!

Francois Peyrot 25 year old XO Cognac\$67.99

Frapin Château Fontpinot, Grande Champagne Cognac.....\$87.99

How can you beat a single vineyard Cognac from Grande Champagne! This Premier Cru Cognac comes from a 200 ha single vineyard that surrounds the Frapin family château. It is distilled, aged and bottled at the château. It has a

rich amber color with beautiful aromatics on the nose. On the palate it has lovely roundness, finesse and an unbelievable finish. 41% ABV.

Glen Grant 31 year old, Lonach\$124.99

What makes Glen Grant unique it that it is one of the few distilleries to use coal-fired stills. Located in the Speyside region at the north end of the village of Rothes, about 10 miles south of Elgin, it is an important component of Chivas Regal. Color: Beautiful Islay Sunrise. Nose: A very deep rich nose filled with coconut, roasted macadamia nuts and sticky toffee pudding. Palate: Beautiful weight on this malt and a rich oiliness that coats your mouth. Buttery puff pastry, sweet baked apples, with just a hint of spice. Finish: A luxurious creamy finish that doesn't want to let go of your palate. Simply Stunning!

Hazelburn 8 year old Triple Distilled Campbeltown\$81.99

Hazelburn is a triple distilled, completely unpeated single malt produced at the Springbank Distillery. It has not been chill filtered and no caramel has been added. Tasting notes from the distillery—Color: Pale gold. Nose: Light and delicate, the 8-year old Hazelburn has subtle nuances of raspberry coulis, shortbread and sherbet. Sweet vanilla, malt and white oak are also in evidence. Palate: Elegantly sweet and malty. Loads of vanilla flavour combines well with toasty oak notes leading to a spicy aftertaste. No smokiness in triple distilled Hazelburn. Finish: A slightly peppery finish to a refined and elegant dram.

Leopold Gourmel Cognac Age des Fleurs "15 Carats"\$65.99

Roger Groult 15 year old Calvados Pay d'Auge\$73.99

This 15-year old calvados has a deep, rich color and the bouquet becomes more elegant, complex and sophisticated with age. The flavors are of spicy apples and vanilla, which blend together for a finish that is very long and elegant. Balanced with a good persistence, it's a nice compromise between the fresh fruity aromas and the concentration of an old spirit.

Ron Pampero Aniversario Rum, Venezuela\$29.99

Double Gold Medal - 2007 San Francisco World Spirits Competition. 96 pts Beverage Tasting Institute: "Dark chestnut. Full-bodied. Reminiscent of butter-scotch, pipe tobacco, coffee, black walnut. Rich, creamy texture. So smooth and deep, one may be tempted to use a spoon..."

Rosebank Signatory Lowland Single Malt\$66.99

Russian Standard St. Petersburg Vodka\$19.99
